- Approved a contract with the DMC Design Group for engineering service for the design and bid phase of the asphalt overlay project and construction oversight.
- The Board accepted the resignation of Don Johnston as chairman of the Maintenance Committee and approved the appointment of Roy Dohner and David Ontiveros as Cochairmen of the committee.
- Conferred with legal counsel on legal and litigation issues and conducted several hearings and imposed fines.
- Approved the nomination of Donna Rosecrans as a new member of the Landscape Committee.
- Approved the nomination of Bob Russell as a new member of the Maintenance Committee.

- Approved the nomination of Bill Rosecrans as a new member of the Architectural Control Committee.
- Appointed Grover Brown as the Election Inspector and approved Bob Scott, Lee Writer, Bob Borland, Gerlinde Duffy, Janet Dohner and Patty Therolf as members of the Election Committee.
- ▶ Reviewed and approved the election notice, ballot and related election materials for the upcoming Board election.
- Approved the 2004 Financial Audit conducted by Schonwit & Associates.
- Approved the bid by D.P. Reynolds Corporation to repair Manta Court slope damage.
- Approved the installation of a speed bump at the Mariner Drive outbound lane to control excessive speed.

# ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL **COMMITTEE**

The incredible amount of rain this year has caused more water intrusion problems than usual. Those with homes with a zero-lot-line wall should check the swale or other drainage to make sure it is clear of all debris next to your neighbor's wall. Plants must be kept at least six inches away from the wall, with no plants over three feet in the easement area. Vines planted in the easement areas are not permitted to grow on the walls of adjacent properties, Rule 4152. The dirt at the wall must be at least four inches from the weep screed, the area where the stucco or other material meets the concrete of the foundation. The dirt should be sloped slightly away from the wall.



# TRAFFIC AND SAFETY **COMMITTEE**

- 1. This committee wishes to thank all those who participated in making the Disaster Preparedness Drill another successful event.
- 2. Residents are reminded to follow the written notices posted regarding entry at the Selva and Cabrillo Isle gates. Tailgating a vehicle and/or improperly entering the gates will result in tires being punctured, and the Board will not reimburse drivers for the damage. It is important that the gate cycle be complete after each car enters in order for the system to work properly.
- 3. The streets in Niguel Shores are subject to the California Vehicle Code. Citations are being regularly issued for parking on the sidewalk, blocking driveways, and not parking in designated spaces, such as on the bay streets where the streets are narrow and impede emergency vehicles, and in front of trash receptacles on trash days.

Remember, multiple citations will result in a car being towed.

It is important that all residents understand that the community grounds are maintained by a professional landscape service. If something needs attention, please fill out a *Homeowner's Request Form* at the office to inform the staff.

The community is having a problem with vandalism. Sprinkler heads are being removed and broken. These heads cost \$10-12 each. Over 30 have recently been destroyed. We request that every homeowner be on the lookout for these vandals and immediately report actions to the office. The parties or their parents will be held liable for replacement.

*Our newly revamped pool will be shared by many* residents and well used this summer and in the future. However severe disregard for existing rules and lack of security present a hazard. Rules such as no jumping from the sides of the pool, no playing in the swim lane or on the line, no objects and toys in the pool, and unsupervised children under 14 create safety problems in the pool area. These rules need to be enforced for safety of all users of the pool. In addition there needs to be a time set aside for lap swimming and water exercising. A large number of residents use the pool for these activities year around. It is impossible for the many people who use the pool for these pool activities to feel safe and be able to carry out these activities coexisting with swim play and fun in the pool. In the past there had been out-of-date signage that designated "Adult Swimming." This wording had existed from the beginning of the pool use. With the renovated pool we could use new, correct signs identifying "Lap Swimming"

and exercise time. This would not exclude young lap swimmers or children requiring physical therapy exercises during those times. Dr. Joan Sandberg




