BOARD ACTIONS

MAY 3, BOARD MEETING

- Accepted the resignation of four members of the Recreation Committee.

- Approved the purchase of new Dell office computers as recommended by the Finance Committee and reserved for in the 2006 budget.
- Approved termination of pay telephone contract in the pool area.
- Reviewed status of Kara Bay parking issue and approved letter from General Manager to Kara Bay homeowners regarding changes in parking status.

MAY 15, SPECIAL EXECUTIVE SESSION

- Approved Sewer Facilities Agreement and granted 2 easements to South Coast Water District. In return, SCWD agrees to pay approximately 57% of total street Repaving Project.

COMMUNITY CENTER REVITALIZATION

The Revitalization Team met with the architect on May 16 to review the final proposed design of phase 2, the office complex. The plan included minor changes recommended during the last meeting and included exterior color renderings. Samples exterior were also provided.

A color rendering of the North and South Elevations, as well as the office floor plan is included with this publication.

After careful examination, the Team unanimously accepted the design as final and directed the architect to proceed with the development and structural phase of design. Considerable additional detailed design work will be required after this step.

The plans were submitted to the ACC for comment and direction. They held a special meeting for this review and authorized the erection of story poles on the site, so owners can get an overview of the site position and sizing.

The renderings are available for viewing in the office window and on the inside wall of the multipurpose room.

We will be meeting with the City and the Fire Authority as the next step in obtaining permits. Demolition remains targeted for October.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

COMMUNICATION

There are three avenues of communication between the staff, the Board and the members and residents of Niguel Shores. One is the *Seashore News*, which comes to your door once a month. Another is the Niguel Shores Web site <u>niguelshores.org</u>, which is available 24/7 by computer. The last is the Homeowners' Open Forum which is held on the third Wednesday of each month, during the open Board meeting. A possibility for a fourth avenue is under consideration, and that is e-mail. With e-mail contact, information from the Board or from Management to residents and members of the Association could be quicker and cheaper than by U.S.P.D. Your input is requested as to the desirability (or not) of this.

The Communication Committee would like to invite anyone interested in being a reporter for the *Seashore News* to make himself or herself known to the office. This could be a roving reporter or someone assigned to a "beat". There are no age limits, just interest and ability.

FINANCE

The Finance Committee is currently campaigning for new volunteers in order to fill two empty slots. And no, it is not because we are undesirable.

One member will be traveling or at a second home the majority of the year, so he felt he should resign. Perhaps we can get him back on the committee later on. Another member is sliding over to the maintenance committee due to the election of Roy Dohner and Dave Ontiveros to the Board and subsequent departure from the Maintenance Committee.

The Finance committee is actively involved in the budget process, the reserve fund analysis, the daily operating expenses, and new and ongoing contracts. It is a team effort, so people of expertise in all these areas are needed.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

If your home has a zero lot line and you need to access your easement for repair of your property, please talk to your neighbor first, giving the time your contractor is available and the scope of the work to be done. Most neighbors will cooperate. If the owner of the neighboring property is an absentee owner,

have the office contact the owner. If your neighbor does not cooperate, you should then write a letter with the above information. If you still do not get any results, you will need to fill out a *Home Owner Request Form*, available from the office or on the Niguel Shores website, at www.niguelshores.org and send it to the Architectural Control Committee. We will contact the homeowner for you. If we have no success, we will direct the problem to the Board of Directors for a hearing and possible fine.

LANDSCAPE

For those of you who live either on the top or the toe of a slope, please take a moment to refresh your memory regarding our community guidelines that apply to slope plantings. Also, on association property, no planting or trimming of existing landscaping is allowed. Tapping into an association irrigation system for your personal use, is never allowed.

4113 Slope Plantings:

"No tree or shrub growing on a slope shall be allowed to grow higher than three feet above the top of the slope or bank, unless such height does not unreasonably interfere with views from any other lot. No planting shall be permitted to remain on any slope which might damage or interfere with established slope ratios, create erosion or sliding problems, or interfere with established drainage functions facilities."

MAINTENANCE

- ▶ Picnic tables on Beach Bluff have been refinished.
- ► Stonehill gate and wall damaged gate has been replaced and the damaged wall has been painted.
- ► Entrance aprons at Cassandra and Taranto Bays after several rain delays, construction completed.
- ► Community Center Renovation project preliminary plans submitted to Architectural Control Committee.
- ► Street overlay project commencement is pending final agreement with SCWD and coordination with Headlands in regards to the underground sewer installation by the SCWD.
- ► Water Remediation project construction of new drainage trench begun on Magellan, which will handle overflow of underground water in that area.

COMMITTEE REPORTS CONTINUED:

- ▶ Water Irrigation Task Force computer mapping by AutoDesk pending, and sensor controlled system proposals are under review.
- ► Handicap pool entrance gate investigating the installation of a motor to open and close the gate with automatic shutdown if the gate touches anything while ▶pening or closing.

Replacement of signage at Garibaldi, Manta, and Breakers Isle – signage received and installation is underway.

► Emergency plans for pedestrian and automobile entrance gates during power outages – consultant's recommendation pending.

TRAFFIC AND SAFETY

- Parking Citations: Remember, the streets in Niguel Shores are subject to the California Vehicle Code. Citations are being regularly issued for parking on the sidewalk, in front of fire hydrants and in front of trash receptacles on trash day.
- Rule 6405-Overnight Parking: the Security patrol will be citing resident vehicles and/or guest vehicles with no visible identification parked on the street between 1:00 am and 6:00 am in violation of this rule. Multiple offenses could result in the vehicle being towed away.
- Bar Code Reader at the Entry Gates: Residents are complaining that the Bar Code Reader is failing to activate the gate arm. Here are some examples of why that may be happening to you.
- Passing the reader TOO fast. Try slowing down as you pass.
 - You may be TOO close to the reader reducing

the viewing range. Try passing farther from the reader.

- The sun may be causing the reader a problem. There are certain times of the day that the sun shines into the mechanism and there is nothing we can do. This is especially true for the Mariner, Selva and Cabrillo Isle gates this time of year.
- Be sure that the gate arm is fully down before you activate the system. This is especially true for the Mariner gate.

SEA TERRACE PARK

On Wednesday, June 7 the Dana Point Planning Commission will take the first step towards the completion of Sea Terrace Park. The plan being recommended by the sub-committee will have rolling hills, trees, walkways, picnic tables and two overlooks. If you walked through the park in the past week, you probably noticed that the tunnel is being painted. The circle in front of the tunnel will be paved and relandscaped. While some grading may be done in the near future, the main work will begin in the spring of 2007 and be completed in the fall. Areas within the park have been set aside for a new library, a play yard, a picnic area, a rest room and extra parking. These will be completed as money or grants become available.

Letters are welcome and limited to 200 words, typed if possible, including name, address and phone number of writer. Refer to NSCA Rule #5221,2,3. Submissions are due on the 17th of the month except in Feb., Nov., and Dec. when due on the 15th of the month.

We want to remind the residents of Niguel Shores that the speed limit in a residential area is 25 mph. We watch cars traveling on Halyard, Niguel Shores Drive and Windward, full tilt at 40 – 50 mph.
